53/23	The minutes of the Full Council Meeting held on the 13 th February 2022 and the Finance Committee held on the 13 th February were signed as a true and correct record by the Chairman Cllr M Ferris. Proposed Cllr L Jackson, seconded Cllr C Daly.	
54/23	Public Participation. 1. The applicants from planning application PA23/0089 attended, Upward extension of existing bungalow to provide a new first floor level and creation of off-road parking spaces to front of property with associated dropped kerb and gave a brief regarding the plans for extension and answered questions from members. 2. Cllr S Carlyon reported that issues with parking remain and are worsening around the entrance to Kennall Vale woods. The Clerk agreed to contact the Police contact and Cornwall Wildlife Trust.	MG

59/23	<p>Due to the late April meeting, it was agreed to consider a further planning application that the Parish Council are being consulted on -</p> <p>PA23/00898 Upward extension of existing bungalow to provide a new first floor level and creation of off-road parking spaces to front of property with associated dropped kerb. Dingles Close, Ponsanooth.</p> <p>After much discussion Ponsanooth Parish Council agreed that the principle of upward extensions to bungalows on Dingles Close would be acceptable to provide accommodation for growing families, however this application was not supported on design grounds. The proposal would effectively replace the bungalow with a two storey building but because of its design would look out of keeping both in the near and more distant views in the village. The elevations show a poor-quality building design which lacks any architectural merit which runs counter to the Cornwall Design Guide. Further, the removal of most of the front garden for the creation of car parking spaces would also erode the street scene and lead to an overdevelopment of the site.</p>	
60/23	<p>The Clerk confirmed responses to queries on the Growth and Prosperity fund grant have been sent in but no news on the success of the application has been received yet.</p>	
61/23	<p>The Clerk confirmed the draft accessible budget expended communication will be ready for Monday 13th March 2023</p>	
62/23	<p>The finance report was received for March 2023, including income received for February and the payment schedule for March and April 2023. Proposed Cllr M Ferris, seconded Cllr C Daly. All Agreed.</p>	
63/23	<p>The PPFA have confirmed a proposal of responsibilities. The next step is for the Parish Council to consider these and confirm acceptance prior to the renewal of the Charity agreement. It was proposed a working meeting be set up with the Clerk, Cllr Daly, Cllr Beckett and Cllr Ferris on the 23rd March 23 12pm. 2nd Cllr Ferris, all agreed.</p>
